BPC136/15 PUBLIC FORUM

There was one member of the public present but no questions were raised.

BPC137/15 DISTRICT COUNCILLOR DAVID CARD'S REPORT (see attached report)

BPC138/15 COUNTY COUNCILLOR JULIA TRUELOVE'S REPORT (see attached report)

Cllr Truelove was unable to be present, but had sent a written report ahead of the meeting. Main points : Syrian Vulnerable Persons Scheme, Road Closures, Suffolk's Devolution proposals, Revue of care support to live at home, Working Together Awards Programme. BPC146/15 PLANNING

i) There were no applications for consideration.

ii) **2916/15 Broadlands, Barking Tye** - It was reported that this application has been granted by MSDC with a recommendation from Suffolk Fire Service that a sprinkler be installed due to the barn's distance from the nearest water hydrant.

The Chair returned to the meeting at this point.

iii) **3140/15 - Plots 5 & 6 Moat Farm Barns** – It was reported that this application has been refused by MSDC. It was proposed that the Council further considers what can be done at the Moat Farm Barns site to improve highway safety. All to look for good examples of traffic calming in other parts of Suffolk.

BPC147/15 FINANCE

i) **Clerk's Finance Report** (*attached to these minutes*)

BPC148/15 GRANT REQUEST – ST MARYS CHURCH , BARKING

It was reported that a request had been received from the Parochial Church Council of St Marys Church, Barking, for a grant towards the upkeep of the churchyard/grass cutting.

BPC149/15 RENEWAL OF WATER MAIN

It was reported that works to replace the water main have been interrupted due to an unexpected mandatory 28 day consultation with the Commoners. This expires on 3rd December after which date it is hoped work will continue by laying the new water main in the Tye. It was further reported that another full road closure is planned from 11th January for one month to complete the works. It was suggested that any diversion route in January/February needs to be carefully considered as not all the diversion route is routinely gritted during bad weather. **Decision** - Clerk to raise this issue with SCC Highways.

BPC150/15 ACTION PLAN 2015 – 2016 (see website)

A draft Action Plan was presented for consideration. **Decision** – It was proposed and resolved to adopt the Action Plan as presented. It will form the basis of pro-active actions to be taken by the Parish Council and will be kept under constant review. It was reported that one of the dog bins on the Tye (near Lower Farm) is full to overflowing. It was suggested that as the Village Caretaker, Dick Nash, is currently unwell and unable to empty the bin, that the bin be added to the schedule of bin emptying by MSDC. **Decision** –It was proposed and resolved that the Clerk arrange for the bin to be emptied now (under her delegated authority powers), and to consider the long term emptying at the next scheduled meeting. Councillor Julia Truelove Report November 2015

SYRIAN VULNERABLE PERSONS SCHEME

Suffolk Public Sector leaders have unanimously agreed to support the Syrian Vulnerable Persons Scheme by offering to take up to 200 refugees. The location of suitable services in greater Ipswich means that the refugees will be settled predominantly in that area. A county wide task group has been established to make sure Suffolk is ready to accept refugees. How the public might help will be known shortly.

ROAD CLOSURE ISSUES THROUGHOUT THE DIVISION

Since the start of the Broad Band project laying cable from Stowmarket to Wattisham Base there have been prolonged and extensive road closures affecting most of the customary routes through the Division. Many of the road closures have resulted in long diversionary routes for most of us, two of them lasting months and one of them not finished yet. I have met the Chief Director of Services and will shortly be meeting the new Highways Director to discuss the serious issues arising and hope that S.C.C. will be more involved with co-ordination, communication and regular inspections. Following our meeting, S.C.C. Highways Director has offered to meet with Barking Parish Council to discuss the issues arising.

SUFFOLK'S DEVOLUTION PROPOSALS

One of the designated seven work streams has focussed on economic growth.

The key ideas include: Ways of boosting productivity, Mechanisms to unlock growth, Strategic partnerships to accelerate housing growth, Reform to the skills and education systems.

The above will be refined, discussed and agreed by the Challenge Session Team, then presented to senior politicians and civil servants in early November. The outcomes will be reflected on by S.C.C. and District Council Leaders together with the New Anglia Local Enterprise Partnership ahead of the Government's Comprehensive Spending Review on 25th November.

NEW HOME REVUE CARE SUPPORT TO LIVE AT HOME


S.C.C. , whilst remaining committed to delivering a new model of support have, for the time being, delayed its implementation. S.C.C. will now review the position case by case rather than from a geographical basis. The approach has arisen because of the complexities of the customer reviews and the changes to the systems to implement them. You will recall that social services and the N.H.S are now working more closely together to meet the needs of those requiring care.

AWARDS PROGRAMME – WORKING TOGETHER FUND

Awards of up to £10,000 could be made to community applicants whose work reflects outstanding service delivery or community activity achieved as a result of increased collaborative working. The fund is open to charities, community groups and not for profit organisations.

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**District Councillor Report for November 2015 prepared by Cllr David Card 2 Nov 2015

MSDC Treasury Management Plan - I was given reassurance following my question to the September Full Council meeting that making Long Term Investments of up to £10million from reserves to provide a new income stream of some £250,000 per annum is allowed under the rules. The Council had previously also agreed in principle to borrow up to £25million for an investment return aimed at mitigating reduction in central government grant funding.

Stowmarket Food Enterprise Zones. My suggested that all local food Businesses be invited to a meeting to learn what this could mean for them appears to have been taken on board. I await details of date and venue and will advise you accordingly. In the meantime if any local food business wishes to find out more do contact me.

Stowmarket Technology Hub – a proposal is being developed within the town that may have useful ramifications for us in the surrounding villages.

Barking and other Road Closures – I have had a number of complaints about the 24/7 long term road closures. Although this is not a District Council responsibility I have said I would welcome a meeting called by SCC to discuss the problems and the inconvenience long term 24/7 road closures cause. I am told the next Barking Road closure will be after Christmas in the New Year.

Community Infrastructure Levy - Although we were told that the decision to adopt this new levy would be sought at our September full council meeting this has still to happen.

District Councillor “one off” £5,000 Community/Locality Grant Fund - Each District Councillor has a budget of £5,000 of taxpayers money to recommend for local good causes. So far I have had no formal approaches and we have until early January 2016 to get bids in. Any organisation with a community project should contact me to start their bid by completing a Grant Application form.

Community Achievement Awards – nominations are sought across 4 categories- Rising Sta, Community Hero, Action in the Community and Outstanding Local Business. The closing date for nominations is the 31st December 2015.

Community Led Planning – Currently a much more formal and expensive scheme called Neighbourhood Plans has operated. The take up has not been that high so MSDC are proposing a simpler scheme called “Community Led Planning”. Guidance on the scheme is expected to be made public shortly. This idea was last month’s Joint Strategic Plan topic.

Scam Warnings – Council Tax Rebates - Fraudsters have been phoning victims telling them that they have been placed in the wrong council tax bracket for a number of years and are entitled to a rebate worth about £7,000. Once the victim is convinced, the fraudster tells them that in order to receive the rebate they will need to pay an administration fee in advance. The fraudsters have mainly been targeting victims aged 60 and over. Reports have come from the Sussex area, but it is likely that the fraudsters will also start to target victims in other areas.

Devolution of Powers Debate - The Government’s Cities and Local Government Devolution Bill is being worked up behind the scenes. The Bill makes provision for the public sector including local authorities to ‘bid’ to run functions currently delivered centrally by devolving powers to a more local level. Suffolk registered their interest in time only to be told to think again and work with Norfolk and consider an elected mayor. This is a fast moving debate that has already consumed much senior official and leading member’s time and resource.

Joint Strategic Plan to 2019 This Plan remains at the core of MSDC thinking and approach (quote *“the plan acts as an inspiration for all our communitiesto work with us to deliver the best ways of achieving the plan’s outcomes”*). Babergh District Council have reviewed their plan and I continue to push MSDC to follow suit.

Housing - *“Explore innovative approaches to housing delivery such as Self build, co-Housing, Community Land Trusts and Equity share”*... especially for the First Time Buyer”.

Economy & Environment- *“... adopt the Community Infrastructure Levy (whereby developers contribute to new facilities with some of the monies retained by town and parish councils) and work with communities to ensure that local infrastructure is invested in, to support new developments”*

Communities- *“Identify and work with communities who wish to take up their rights (community right to build, community right to buy, community right to challenge, community right to bid, neighbourhood planning)”*

Economy & Environment- *“Community led planning will be supported and we are already making good progress where communities are prepared to lead sustainable growth in their areas”*

This month’s topic:- Economy & Environment - *“Understanding our businesses and building relationships will help us to target our resources and deliver services directly to them or connect them quickly to the support available”*.

The Food Enterprise Scheme and The Stowmarket Technology Hub are two projects being worked up. There is also a project called Gateway 14 around Ipswich. MSDC are holding events for networking with business and any business that wishes to find out more do contact me. I have suggested that a JOINT Local Business Forum with quarterly meetings and an annual forum with active member participation. That could include Procurement opportunities, infrastructure provision including the award of the new Rail franchise and what our communities expect of the new franchise, better roads and connectivity with both land lines and mobiles, broadband, water, waste.....etc....
